Lesson 4 — THE PLAN OF SALVATION

"For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved." — John 3:17

This lesson explains God's great rescue plan for humanity—how He saves us from sin: its penalty, its power, and finally its presence. It reveals the love of God shown through Jesus Christ, the only One who can redeem, restore, and transform the sinner.

1. What is sin?

Sin is the breaking of God's law.

Scripture: 1 John 3:4

2. Do sins done in ignorance count?

God does not hold a man guilty if he truly did not know.

Scripture: Romans 2:12

3. From what does man need to be saved?

The penalty, power, and presence of sin.

Scripture: Romans 6:23; Romans 8:7; 2 Peter 3:13

4. Can man save himself?

No—he cannot atone for past sins nor change his own nature.

Scripture: Romans 3:20; Jeremiah 13:23

5. Who alone can save us?

Jesus Christ, who died for our sins.

Scripture: John 3:16; Romans 5:8

6. What does Christ's death provide?

Pardon for every sin and freedom from condemnation.

Scripture: Isaiah 53:5; Romans 8:1

7. How does God give us victory over sin's power?

Through the new birth and the Holy Spirit dwelling within.

Scripture: John 3:5; Romans 8:3–4

8. What does God freely give to help us overcome?

Repentance, His Spirit, the Scriptures, and prayer.

Scripture: Acts 5:31; Psalm 119:105; Hebrews 4:16

9. What is man's part in salvation?

Look to God, believe in Jesus, repent, confess, and obey.

Scripture: Isaiah 45:22; Acts 16:31

10. What must we do with known sins?

Confess and forsake them.

Scripture: 1 John 1:9; Proverbs 28:13

11. What follows true repentance?

Restitution when possible.

Scripture: Ezekiel 33:15–16

12. How do we walk in victory daily?

Be led by the Spirit and obey God's law.

Scripture: Romans 8:14; Romans 6:12

13. Will Christ ever turn away a sincere seeker?

Never—He receives all who come to Him.

Scripture: John 6:37

14. What danger do we face if we neglect salvation?

There is no escape for those who refuse God's mercy.

Scripture: Hebrews 2:1–3

15. What is the ultimate goal of salvation?

To restore us into God's family as sons and daughters forever.

Scripture: 1 John 3:1; 2 Corinthians 5:19

CLOSING APPEAL

The plan of salvation reveals a God who loves you more than life itself. He sent His Son not to condemn you, but to save you. He offers pardon for your past, power for your present, and the promise of a sinless future in His kingdom. Today, Jesus invites you to accept His rescue plan.
